(Public Corporation) The Senzoku Scenic Association was founded in 1933 to protect the natural environment and historical scenery of both Senzoku Pond and the Koike District. The long-term urbanization of these areas has created various issues such as a decrease in green space due to residential land development. Currently, with past presidents taking on a central role, directors and members are working together in cooperation with related administrative agencies to carry out environmental protection, cultivation, and efforts to increase public awareness.



The Designation of Senzoku Pond Park as a National Place of Scenic Beauty

Senzoku Pond has been known as a scenic spot along the Nakahara Highway since the Edo period (1603-1868). It was depicted in Utagawa Hiroshige's ukiyo-e prints "Meisho Edo Hyakkei" (One Hundred Famous Views of Edo), was chosen as the location for Kaishu Katsu's villa "Senzokuken", and is enjoyed by many as a lush green retreat. In addition, Senzoku Hachiman Shrine beside the pond carries the history of the legends of Minamoto no Yoritomo and his horse Ikezuki, while the Myofuku-ji Temple is home to the legend of the Nichiren Kesagake-no-Matsu. In recent years, Senzoku Pond Park has become a famous spot for cherry blossom and autumn leaf viewing, as well as for its environmental improvements as a park home to gin-yanma dragonflies. The park attracts many visitors, including those who come to enjoy boat rides.

In March 2019, Senzoku Pond Park became the first place in Ota City to be designated as a place of national scenic beauty by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government in recognition of its outstanding natural scenery centering on the pond, its many historical and cultural assets, and the initiatives of local residents.

Shunsho no Hibiki Background Information

The Senzoku Pond Shunsho no Hibiki concert was first held in 1995 to commemorate the completion of the triple-arched bridge built on the west bank of Senzoku Pond (Ikezuki Bridge). Living national treasure and master flute player Sanzaemon Takara (1922-2010) was invited to play for the first concert. We hope you will enjoy the performance in the historic Senzoku Pond Park, a national place of scenic beauty.




