Ota City has published an information booklet for foreign residents. It is distributed free of charge and packed with information useful in daily life.





Information concerning Submission of "Current Situation Notification" and Payment Months for the Child Allowance Program

Submission of "Current Situation Notification"

Persons wishing to continue receiving a child allowance or special allowance without interruption from June must submit a "Current Situation Notification."

If you are such a person, Ota City will mail the necessary form to you in early June. Please submit your form by post or electronic application (Pittari Service) by the end of June.

Note that the form will not be accepted at Ota City branch offices.

(1) By post

Use the enclosed return envelope to submit your form (please affix a stamp).

Search for "Ota City Pittari Service" using your internet browser and apply using the link for the application/notification "Current Situation Notification" in the list of procedures.

Scheduled deposit transfer date for June

The payment for the February-May period of 2021 will be deposited on June 9.

* The deposit may be delayed two or three days in the case of some financial institutions.

Child allowance (for person whose income is below the income limit)

| Age category | Payment amount (monthly) |
|---|-----------------------------|
| 0 to under age 3 (flat rate) | 15,000 yen/month |
| From age 3 until completion of elementary school education (1st child and 2nd child) | 10,000 yen/month |
| From age 3 until completion of elementary school education (3rd child and later children) | 15,000 yen/month |
| Junior high school student (up to first March 31st after 15th birthday) (flat rate) | 10,000 yen/month |

* Counting of the first child begins with a child being raised who is no older than 18 years old (up to the first March 31st after his/her 18th birthday).

Special allowance (for person whose income meets or exceeds the income limit)

No age classification (flat rate): 5,000 yen/month

Remember to Submit a Status of Residency Application for Your Newborn Baby!

If you have a baby with foreign nationality who was born in Japan, he or she can stay in Japan for 60 days without acquiring status of residence. However, if your child will stay in Japan for longer than 60 days, you must submit an application to acquire status of residence for him or her at the Tokyo Regional Immigration Bureau within 30 days of his or her birth date.

Ota City's Educational Consultation Office

- The Educational Consultation Office offers consultation (in person or by telephone) concerning your child's education, personality or behavioral concerns, or developmental disorders.
- It will also provide advice (in person or by telephone) concerning worries in your child's daily life, such as bullying or relationships with friends, as well as anxieties regarding his or her study or academic path.
- The office will make home visits as your child's situation requires, provide information on welfare services and the like, and coordinate with concerned organizations.

Eligibility

- Children living in Ota City who are currently enrolled in compulsory education and their parents/guardians
- Children who wish to attend the adaptation guidance class "Tsubasa"

COVID-19 Vaccination News

Public vaccinations for COVID-19 have started.

Ota City is sending out "vaccination tickets" to eligible persons based on the national government's order of priority.

Vaccination stations

- Nine Ota City facilities (exhibition room of Ota City Residents Hall (Aprico), gymnasium of Ota City Residents Plaza, Minemachi Meeting Room meeting room of Rokugo Community Activities Promotion Center, West Building of Ikegami Hall, and four Area Offices)
- 2 Approximately 200 medical institutions (hospitals and health centers)

The vaccination process

- A vaccination ticket arrives at your home by mail.
- You schedule an appointment.
- 3 You go to the vaccination station, bringing the "vaccination ticket," personal identification, and the "medical interview sheet" (filled out).
- Receive a vaccination (to be administered if you are not experiencing any health issues at that time).

Notices when the following warnings or special warnings are announced in Ota City

* "Warning": A message stating "Danger! Stay alert!" sent to everyone. Warnings: Heavy rain, flood, windstorm, snowstorm, heavy snow, waves, high tide (storm surge)

Special warnings: Heavy rain, windstorm, snowstorm, heavy snow, waves, high tide (storm surge)

2 Earthquake

Notices when an earthquake with a seismic intensity of 3 or higher occurs in Ota City

Tsunami

Notices when a tsunami warning or major tsunami warning is announced in the Tokyo Bay area
