# [Accepting Students for ManaViva (Japanese Reading and Writing Class)]

ManaViva is an adult education program for learning how to read and write Japanese characters necessary for daily life (such as hiragana, katakana, and simple sentences). It also covers the basics of the Japanese language, arithmetic in Japanese, and other subjects. Join others like you in the community and the program staff for a fun and useful learning experience.

Eligibility: (1) People living, working, or attending school in Ota City (aged 16 years or older)

### [Enrolling in the National Pension System]



All people between the ages of 20 and 59 who have a certificate of residence in Japan—including non-Japanese residents—must join the National Pension System and pay its premiums. Paying your premiums for more than ten years will make you eligible to receive the National Pension when you reach the age of 65.

The system also includes a 'disability pension' that is paid when you are unable to work due to injury or illness, and a 'survivor's pension' that is paid when a family member who had been supporting you dies.

You must complete the National Pension enrollment procedure when you first arrive in Japan or leave your employer.

You may apply for an exemption if you have difficulty paying the premiums due to low income or other reasons.

## [Lost your Eligibility for Ota City's National Health Insurance Program? You Must Complete the Procedure for Returning Medical Expenses.]

If you visited a medical institution using your insurance card for the Ota City National Health Insurance program after losing your program eligibility because you moved out of Ota City, joined another Japanese public health insurance program, your period of stay in Japan ended, or for any other reason,

you must return the portion of your medical expenses that were paid for by Ota City.



If you have joined another public health insurance scheme or moved out of Ota City, be sure to notify Ota City that you will leave its National Health Insurance program and return the insurance card that was issued to you.
