【Public Bathhouses and How to Use Them】

Ota City has 34 public bathhouses (sento), making it home to the most sento baths among Tokyo's 23 special wards. Fourteen of them are supplied with "kuroyu onsen" (black hot spring) water, said to be "fossil water" coming from ancient seawater. Sento are characterized by their palace-style exteriors and high ceilings. Some have state-of-the-art facilities that allow bathers to see swimming fish as they soak in the tub. There are sento offering bubble baths (jacuzzi), medicinal baths, fragrant baths, and saunas as well as special yuzu citrus baths in December and bontan citrus baths in February. [Child Allowance Procedure during the Year-End and New Year Holidays]

Child allowance applications will not be accepted at service counters between December 29 and January 3. If you have a new baby born in December or have recently moved into Ota City, please submit your application within 15 days from the day after your "date of change" (i.e., your baby's date of birth or your expected moving-out date from your previous place of residence). Your application will be accepted even if you do not have the necessary attached documentation ready, so please submit your application by the deadline.

【Please Observe the “Five Rules for Safe Bicycle Riding.”】
