[Inhabitant Tax Returns for FY2024 are Now Being Accepted.]

1 About the special city inhabitant tax and metropolitan inhabitant tax (inhabitant tax)

- If your annual income exceeds 1,000,000 yen, you may be subject to taxation.
- The inhabitant tax will be imposed on people living in Ota City on January 1, 2024.
- The amount of the tax owed is determined by the amount of income earned from January to December of the previous year.

2 Tax certificate for renewal of status of residence

You may be required to submit a tax certificate to the Immigration Bureau if you will be renewing your status of residence. However, please note that you will be unable to obtain this certificate if you have not filed your tax return. If this applies to you, bring documents showing your income for the previous year (e.g., certificate of income and withholding tax [源泉徴収票], etc.) to the city office to file your tax return.

The office will determine the amount of tax you owe. You will be able to obtain a tax payment certificate after paying this amount.



